**Dr. Scott Burnham**

Class of 1973

**Academic/Cultural/Career Accomplishments**

Scott began playing piano at age 6 and transposing music at age 7. He went on to earn B.M., Music Composition summa cum laude from Baldwin-Wallace College, a M.M., Music Composition from Yale University, Ph.D., Music Theory and Analysis from Brandeis University and is now a Professor of music at Princeton University. He was awarded a National Endowment for the Humanities Fellowship.

Dr. Burnham is regarded as an accomplished, world-renowned researcher, prolific writer and lecturer, having published numerous articles and lectured worldwide on the topics of his research. His book titled *Beethoven Hero* won The Wallace Berry Award, Society of Music Theory. He previously compiled, translated and edited the book A.B. Marx, *Musical Form in the Age of Beethoven; Selected Writings on Theory and Method*. Recent public appearances include lectures at Lincoln Center for the Performing Arts, Carnegie Hall, Metropolitan Museum of Art, the Royal Music Association in London, and the International Conference on 19<sup>th</sup> Century Music in Surrey, England.

Dr. Burnham serves on the Advisory Board, *Beethoven Form*, the Editorial Board, *Journal of the American Musicological Society*, and the editorial Board, *Music Theory Spectrum*.

**Carol Campbell Glickhause**

Class of 1958

**Academic/Career Accomplishments**

A B.S. degree in Education was the reward after 11 years of hard work, resolution and spirit from a very determined Carol Campbell Glickhause, who, during that time, supported herself and financed her entire education. Carol studied five more years to complete an M.S. degree, accomplished during her husband's illness and death. She has dedicated 33 years to education, as a teacher, in Staff Development during the desegregation years, as Principal in Cleveland city urban schools, and as Assistant to the Superintendent. She has worked for the Ohio Department of Education in the Division of Finance as an Area Coordinator, responsible to the State Superintendent. Her dedication to education is exemplary.

Carol has taken over 100 students to live in French Alps in various exchange programs. She participated in an exchange program with Australia, working there as Vice Principal, as part of the International Teaching Fellowship Program. Her selection marked the first time a public school administrator from Ohio was chosen.

Carol is an Adjunct Professor at Baldwin-Wallace College, and a member of Phi Delta Kappa, an Education Honorary. She serves on the Executive Board of "Shoes for Kids," and has chaired several of their campaigns.

**Dr. Robert Knerr**  
Class of 1953  
**Academic/Career Accomplishments**

At Cuyahoga Heights School, Bob Knerr excelled in academics, athletics, and music. He graduated as Valedictorian, having carried a 4.0 g.p.a. throughout school. In football he was named All-County Quarterback and Cleveland Touchdown Club MVP. In basketball, he was All-County Second Team, and in track, County and District champion and State Finalist.

Dr. Knerr attended Johns Hopkins University and Ohio State Medical School, graduating Magna Cum Laude. After Pediatric Residency at Columbus Children's Hospital, he served as a pediatrician in the Army and established his practice in Virginia where he is an Attending Physician and Clinical Instructor at Fairfax Hospital and Georgetown University. Dr. Knerr is an active member of the American Academy of Pediatrics, AMA, and the Fairfax Medical Society. He has published numerous articles about pediatric medical problems, and taught and lectured extensively on childcare and teen problems.

Active in his church, serving as Deacon and Elder, Dr. Knerr has taught seminars on Biblical History and Faith. He serves as an American Rose Society Consulting Rosarian and Horticultural Judge. He has published articles and lectured on rose exhibition, culture, and care, and won "Best in Show" in the 1981 National Rose Show.

**Jack Squirek**  
Class of 1977  
**Athletic Accomplishments**

Jack began his distinguished athletic career at Cuyahoga Heights School where he lettered in football, basketball and track. Jack was named first-team All Northeastern Ohio and third-team All State in football.

As a three-year starter and team captain (1981) for the University of Illinois football squad, Jack was the leading tackler in 1981 and the fifth all-time leading tackler in Illinois history with 334 tackles. He was named UPI and AP Second Team, All Big Ten, Honorable Mention All American, and played in the Blue-Gray All Star and Senior Bowl games.

After graduation Jack was drafted by the Los Angeles Raiders and played outstanding football there from 1982 to 1986. Jack played a significant part in the 1984 Raiders Superbowl victory. Having intercepted a key pass, he took the ball in for a touchdown. Due to his outstanding Superbowl performance, Jack was featured on the cover of Sports Illustrated. He actively participated in 62 NFL regular season and playoff games, finishing his career in 1986 with the Miami Dolphins.

Jack is active in the National Football League Players Association and the Governor's Athletic Program for Highway Safety.
